How this Class Works

- This 6-week fully online, fast-paced course begins Monday, July 1st.
- You will learn in a community with your peers. *This is not a self-paced course*. Pay close attention to due dates! They exist to help you succeed. Four Formal Essays and the Introduction Video must be submitted to pass this class.
- This class does **not** meet regularly on Zoom. This class will be conducted asynchronously (which means "not live") in Canvas.
- By Friday at the end of Week 1, you must log in to our Canvas course, buy *They Say/ I Say*, the required digital textbook, and complete both the Orientation Module and the Week 1 tasks. The Grammar Diagnostic Tool is for self-awareness. It is required but not graded.
- New modules will be published by Monday morning each week, if not sooner.

Discussions

- Initial posts to Discussions are due Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, or Thursdays each week by 11:59 pm. Responses to your classmates are due the next day - Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, or Fridays, respectively, by 11:59 pm. Please pay close attention to due dates. Students may not receive full credit for late posts or responses, but you might receive partial credit for late posts/responses.
- All They Say/I Say tutorials are due Fridays by 11:59 pm. Students will not receive credit for tutorials finished after the due dates.
- Each module contains readings and/or videos, collaborative activities including discussions, and written assignments. Please do the tasks in the order they appear in Modules and pay attention to the due dates.

Course Description

Introduction to university-level reading and writing (5 units) with an emphasis on analysis. Close examination of a variety of texts (personal, popular, literary, professional, academic) from culturally diverse traditions.

Practice in common rhetorical strategies used in academic writing. Composition of clear, well- organized, and well-developed essays, with varying purposes and differing audiences, from personal to academic.

This course is transferable to all UC, CSU, and private colleges.

Course Description:

In this introduction to university-level reading and writing with an emphasis on analysis. This class will improve communication skills, literacy, and critical thinking.

We will write four formal papers -one timed essay and three formal academic essays.

Student Learning Outcome (SLO):

- Practice writing as a multi-step process including planning and revising with attention to varying purposes, audiences, and rhetorical strategies.
- Read and analyze rhetorically and culturally diverse narrative and expository texts from a variety of perspectives.

Students can expect instructor feedback on formal papers and assignments within a week of submission. All formal papers will be graded by a rubric, which is included and available as the assignment becomes available. Papers are graded in terms of sophistication of content and argument; clarity of organization; fluidity of expression through sentence structure; fluency of grammar, punctuation and spelling; and adherence to MLA format.

Turnitin

You will submit essays to Canvas with a tool called **turnitin.com**, which checks for plagiarism. Please think of it as a tool that can help you become a stronger writer! Please do not use AI-generated work for this course. While you may be tempted to use an AI tool to brainstorm and gather ideas for an essay, it is more beneficial for you to answer discussion prompts and homework questions using your opinions, ideas, attitudes, observations of the world around you, and personal experiences. Critical analysis is a human endeavor and creativity requires taking risks. I value unique critical analysis and creative risk-taking when evaluating your essays.

Formatting

Please use MLA formatting for essays, including:

- an MLA header
- 12 point font such as: arial, palentino, times new roman
 - Double-spaced

Late submissions will not receive full points. Summer quarter at De Anza moves rapidly and due dates are in place to help you manage your time and complete all required work at the end of the six weeks.

Every assignment has a due date, rubric, and a deadline for submission. Participants are expected to submit assignments on or before the assigned due date, which, in turn, allows me time to review your work and provide meaningful feedback. Due dates have been designed in the course to ensure time is provided to allow you to produce your best work.

Time management is tough and life happens, so sometimes we miss deadlines! You're in luck: late submissions are accepted with a penalty. Assignments submitted after the deadline may receive a 10% grade point deduction for each day following the due date and time. If you need an extension for any formal essay, please email me before the due date and I can work with you. Discussion due dates cannot be extended, due to their interactive nature, and late discussion posts or responses will not receive full credit. Thank you in advance for understanding.
